COUNTDOWN TO 100: THE CENTENNIAL OF POST 3

On May 8-10, 1919, American Veterans of World War I met in Saint Louis to discuss the establishment of a Veterans organization. From this meeting, the seeds of the American Legion were sown.

World War I Veterans from Kings County returned to central California and solicited interest in forming a local post in Hanford. The first meeting of the nascent post was held on May 27, 1919, in the Board of Trade Room, 211 North Douty Street. Doctor Ralph Motherall was elected the temporary president of the fledgling post. Such was the confidence of local Veterans in the establishment of an American Legion post in Hanford that the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR—an organization for Civil War Veterans) sent a congratulatory letter to the new Legion post dated May 24th, three days before the Legion post held its first organizational meeting.

Establishment of the post was completed on June 20th, 1919, with W.R. Norrish being elected the first official post commander. The establishment of the Hanford American Legion post predated the Congressional charting of the national American Legion by three months; Congress approved the national charter on September 16, 1919.

Chaplain's Corner


