Staff from Kettleman FRC presented an overview on their program. Commissioner Dr. Milton Teske asked April Hatfield how the children were selected for the home visitation program. April answered, when the program started; the FRC went out to outreach events to get the children to become part of the program, and then it went to word of mouth. Kettleman FRC then brought in incentives to get the families to come into the program; the incentive is ‘baby bucks’ to where the families can use their baby bucks at the incentive closet, and there is currently a waitlist for the home visitation program. Commissioner Sanja Bugay asked April if the hours and the days are sufficient for all the programs ran at the Kettleman FRC. April answered it would be more sufficient for the families if the FRC was open more than 3 days a week but because of their budget; the FRC can only be ran 3 days a week for now.

AGENDA ITEM: Reassignment of Administration of Prop 56 Local Oral Health Program

A. Background/History:

In 2016 the voters of California passed Proposition 56, the California Healthcare, research and Prevention Tobacco Tax Act of 2016, that created an additional \$2 tobacco tax. One use for the new revenue was to create a \$30 Million allocation to the state dental program, for the purpose and goal of educating about, preventing and treating dental disease, including dental disease caused by use of cigarettes and other tobacco products. The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has created local funding opportunities in each county. The allocation to Kings county is \$186,104 annually for 4 years.

At the February 2018 First 5 Commission Meeting a study session was conducted to determine if this funding opportunity was a good fit for First 5 Kings. At that meeting the Commission recommended completing an application.

At the April 2018 Commission meeting the completed application was approved by the Commission for submission to CDPH.

At the June 2018 Commission meeting, the Commission approved the contract between First 5 Kings County and California Department of Public Health for the Proposition 56 Oral Health Prevention funding.

B. Summary of Request, Description of Project and/or Primary Goals of Agenda Item:

The Commission will review, discuss and approve Kings County Public Health Department assuming administration of the Proposition 56 Oral Health Prevention grant.

C. Timeframe:

The anticipated transfer of administration of the grant would be July 1, 2020.

D. Costs:

There is no anticipated cost to Proposition 10 funds; however, there would be a loss in revenue of approximately \$186,104 annually through June 30, 2022, of which .05 FTE of the First 5 Program Officer's position and .15 FTE of the First 5 Resource Specialist's position was budgeted. The remainder of the grant funding was allocated for 1.0 FTE of the Oral Health Program Specialist position, as well as other operating and program costs for the Oral Health Program.

E. Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends the commission review, discuss and approve transfer of administration of the Proposition 56 Oral Health Prevention program.

AGENDA ITEM: Extension of Current Contracts and First 5-supported Programs

A. Background/History:

Current contracts and programs supported by First 5 were approved by the Commission in April and June 2019, for the timeframe July 1, 2019-June 30, 2020. These contracts and programs were aligned with the Commission's 2015-2020 Strategic Plan.

B. Summary of Request, Description of Project and/or Primary Goals of Agenda Item:

Staff is requesting that the Commission extend current contracts and programming for one year. Staff is also recommending that expenditures be reduced by at least 15% due to dwindling revenues.

Staff are currently undergoing various activities to complete the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan, with an anticipated completion in April 2020. However, should the Commission continue with the usual process of releasing RFA's after approval of the Strategic Plan, a Special Meeting would need to be held in May 2020 to approve the RFA's submitted. Thereafter, contracts will need to be drafted, reviewed, and approved by all parties. It is highly unlikely that these contracts will be finalized for presentation at the next regular Commission meeting scheduled for June 2, 2020, due to the contracting process.

Should the Commission approve the extension of current contracts, the grantees will need to submit an updated Scope of Work and Budget for FY 2020-2021 by March 2, 2020, to ensure that contract drafts are submitted to the Commission at the June 2, 2020 regular meeting.

C. Timeframe:

Services will be provided from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

D. Costs:

Staff recommend a considerable reduction in award amounts due to the unpredictability and volatility of Proposition 10 funding. Staff anticipate 15-30% reduction in revenues.

E. Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends the commission review, discuss and consider extending current contracts and programming for one year, to ensure continuity of services to the community.

AGENDA ITEM: Strategic Planning

A. Background/History:

At the April 2019 First 5 Kings County Commission Meeting, Commissioner Bugay requested that First 5 host a convening of our funded partners to discuss the impact of static funding. This meeting was hosted on May 13 and all of the funded programs sent at least one representative.

Additionally, Proposition 10 requires all county commissions to “adopt an adequate and complete County Strategic Plan for the support and improvement of early childhood development within the county. The strategic plan must include a description of the goals and objectives proposed to be attained, a description of the programs, services, and projects proposed to be provided, sponsored or facilitated; and a description of how measurable results of such programs, services, and projects will be determined by the County Commission using appropriate and reliable indicators.”

In the past First 5 has used a variety of methods to engage the Commission, Grantees, Stakeholders, Community Partners, and the Community. During past planning cycles we have used community needs surveys, focus groups, evaluation results, fiscal analysis of grantees by a CPA firm, and submissions by grantees.

During the current planning cycle, community input gathered during focus groups and surveys, as well as an inventory of Community Services will be synthesized to create the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan.

B. Summary of Request, Description of Project and/or Primary Goals of Agenda Item:

First 5 Kings County Staff request the Commission review and discuss the Strategic Plan Timeline and the Community Inventory of Services as presented.

C. Timeframe:

The new strategic plan would start implementation on July 1, 2020. All activities would need to be completed and a strategic plan would need to be adopted at the April 2020 Commission Meeting for submission to First 5 California by June 30, 2020.

D. Costs:

No costs are associated with the planning process; however, minimal costs will be accrued related to community outreach.

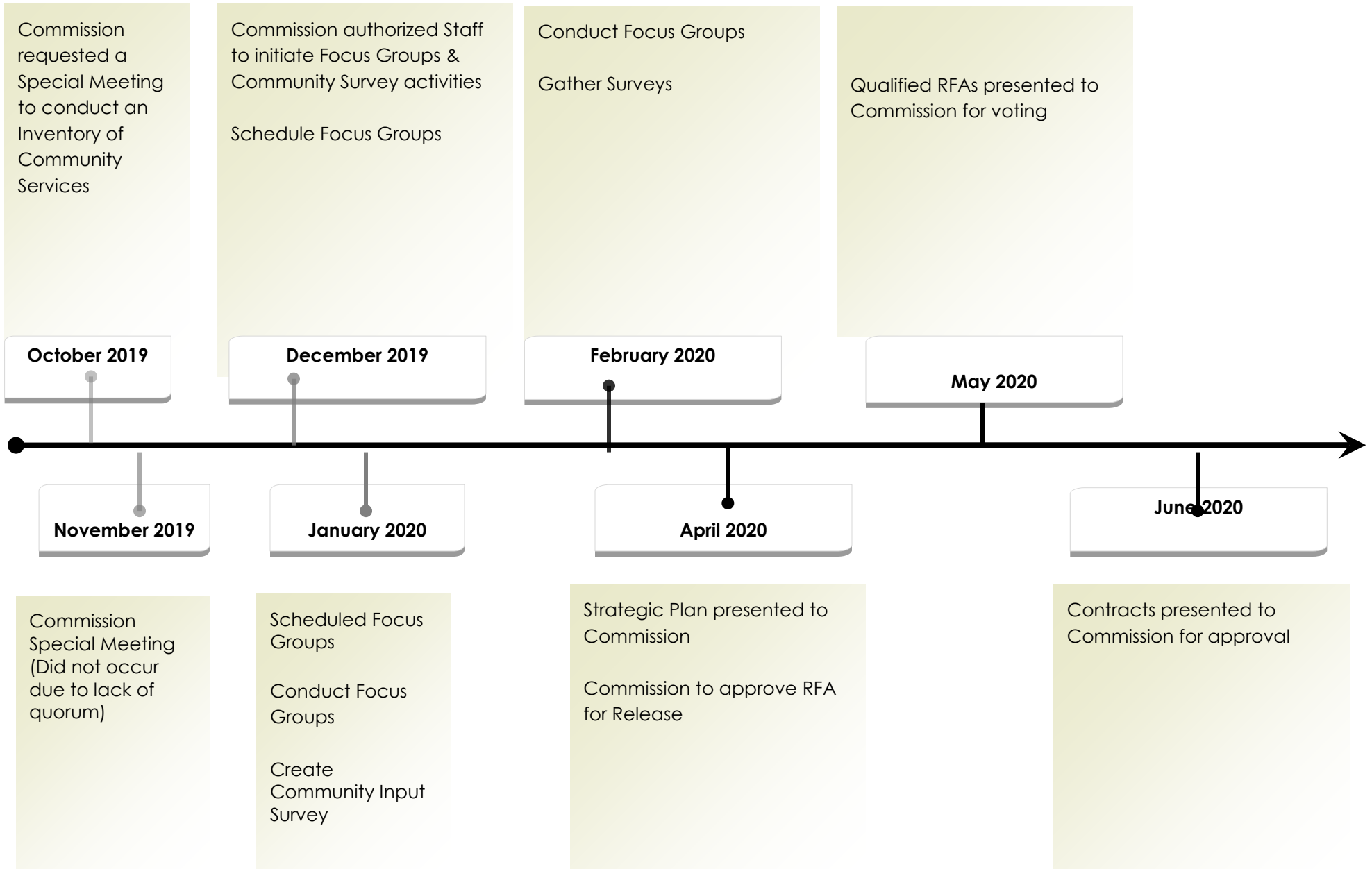

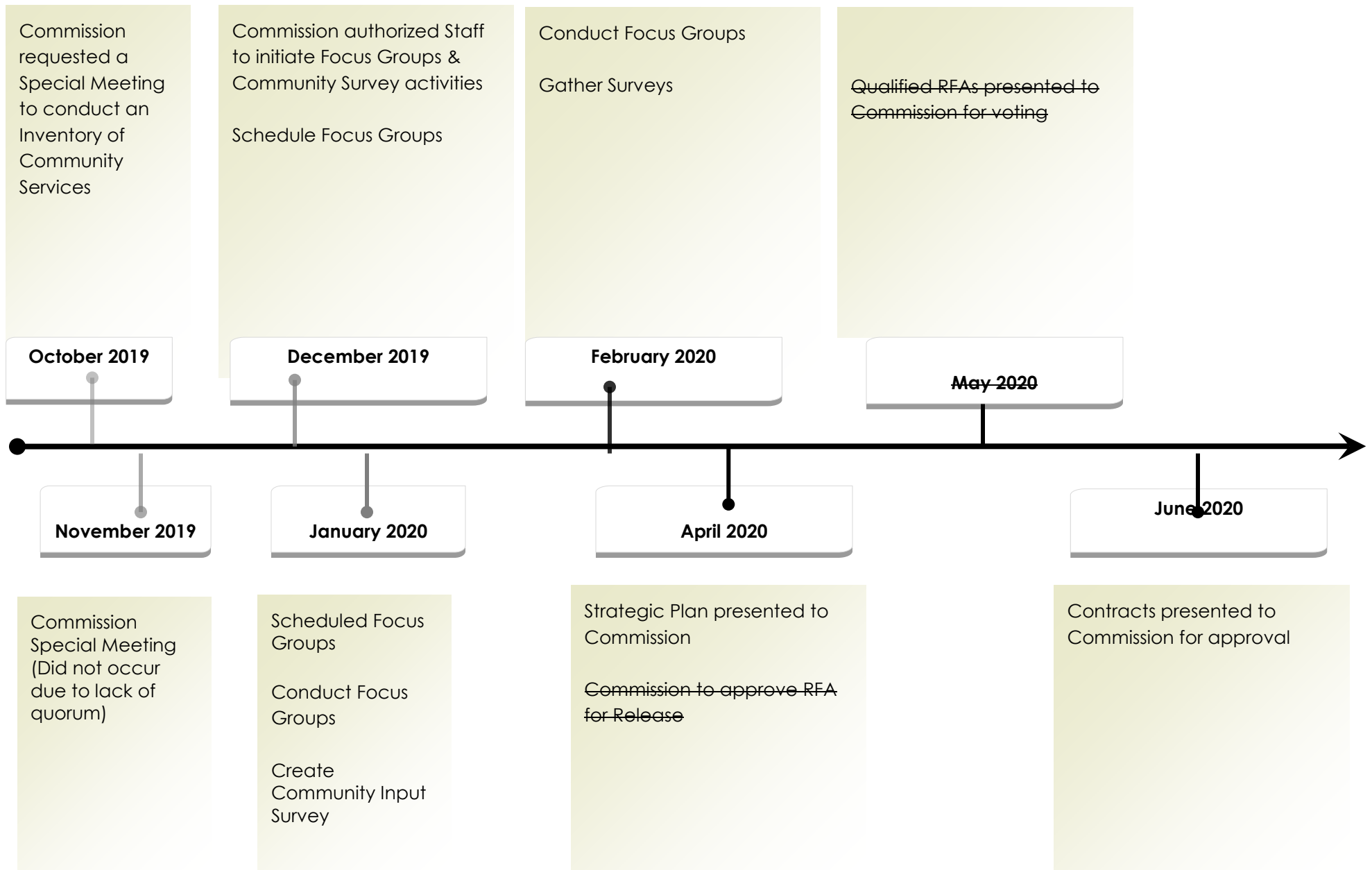

AGENDA ITEM: Strategic Planning

A. Background/History:

At the April 2019 First 5 Kings County Commission Meeting, Commissioner Bugay requested that First 5 host a convening of our funded partners to discuss the impact of static funding. This meeting was hosted on May 13 and all of the funded programs sent at least one representative.

At the October 2019 First 5 Kings County Commission Meeting, the Commission requested to hold a Special Meeting to take inventory of all services available in the community, for children 0-5 and their parents/caregivers. The Commissioners agreed to bring information on services that their agencies/partners provide or are involved in.

Additionally, Proposition 10 requires all county commissions to “adopt an adequate and complete County Strategic Plan for the support and improvement of early childhood development within the county. The strategic plan must include a description of the goals and objectives proposed to be attained, a description of the programs, services, and projects proposed to be provided, sponsored or facilitated; and a description of how measurable results of such programs, services, and projects will be determined by the County Commission using appropriate and reliable indicators.”

In the past First 5 has used a variety of methods to engage the Commission, Grantees, Stakeholders, Community Partners, and the Community. During past planning cycles we have used community needs surveys, focus groups, evaluation results, fiscal analysis of grantees by a CPA firm, and submissions by grantees. While all of these data points have proven to be useful there can be a significant cost associated with each one.

B. Summary of Request, Description of Project and/or Primary Goals of Agenda Item:

First 5 Kings County Staff request the Commission review and discuss the community service inventory as presented.

C. Timeframe:

The new strategic plan would start implementation on July 1, 2020. All activities would need to be completed and a strategic plan would need to be adopted at the February 2020 Commission Meeting to have new contracts in place by July 1, 2020.

D. Costs:

No costs are associated with the planning process; however, minimal costs will be accrued related to community outreach, and possible incentives to stakeholders that participate in the focus groups.

E. Staff Recommendation:

First 5 Kings County Staff request the Commission to review and discuss the information as presented, and to provide guidance on next steps of the Strategic Planning process.



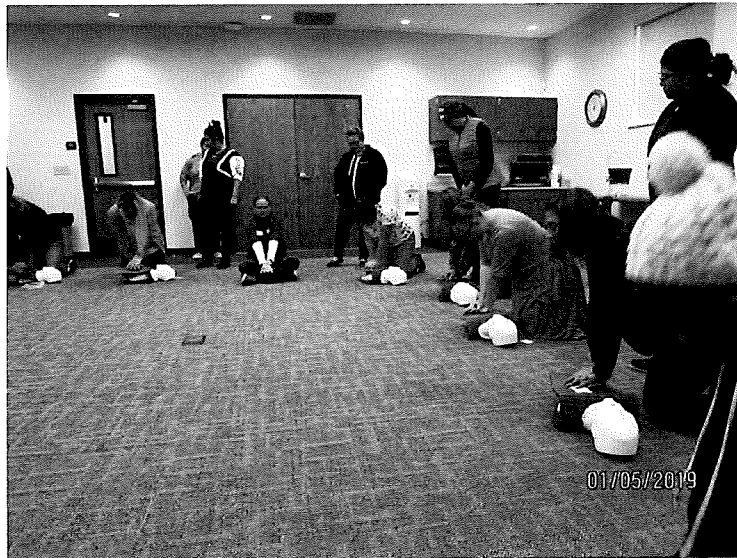

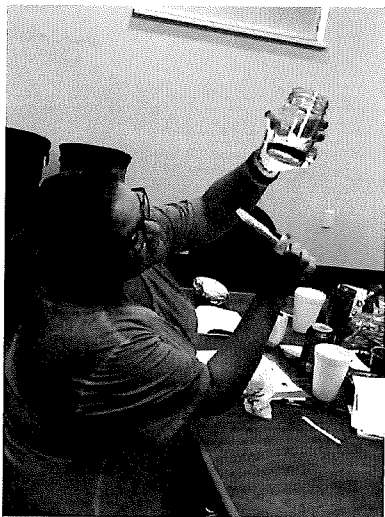

L2L school update: All Linkages to learning school sites recently completed a 2nd round of meetings. They are required to meet 3 times during the school year to plan transition activities. During our last round of meetings schools discussed the upcoming spring activities such as registration and spring orientation. Each school decided on a date for the parent/student spring orientation. This activity will take place during the month of May for most schools. When scheduling a date for this event, teachers also decide what summer packet they would like to give the

students. Usually the packet contains material that children can use to learn and practice their ABC's, numbers, colors and shapes. The goal is to have children working on activities during spring and summer months, before they begin kinder. Other topics discussed were kinder registration and pre- k testing. The majority of schools have provided me with dates for both registration and testing. I will follow up with each school site within the next week or so to confirm these dates. Schools will be contacted again in the spring to meet a 3rd and final time. This meeting will conclude the 2019-20 schoolyear for the linkages program.

- **Back Packs:** The back pack project for 2019-20 is underway. Schools will be contacted shortly to verify dates for kindergarten registration. The back pack vendor has been contacted as well and will be able to meet our deadline in delivering back packs by March. To help get ready for kindergarten registration we have begun the process of hanging street banners in Lemoore and soon in Hanford. I will also reach out to local businesses to ask for free advertising to promote early registration. Delivery of back packs should begin the end of this month.
