CROP REPORT COVER: "Using Cotton Gin Trash for Energy"

It takes about 400,000 BTU's of heat to dry a bale of cotton, or 12 million BTU's per hour for a gin operating at 30 bales per hour. The shortage and higher costs of fossil fuels have caused cotton gins to recognize the value of gin trash as a renewable energy source. This Kings County cotton gin utilizes gin trash in their operation, thus saving costs of valuable fuel and trash disposal.

Gentlemen:

I am pleased to submit this 1980 Agricultural Crop Report, which has been compiled in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The gross value of agricultural crops and products grown in Kings County during the calendar year 1980 was \$635,233,678., a 18% increase over 1979.

Cotton continued to lead all crop production with a gross income of over \$293,850,000.

Rice acreage increased substantially. Safflower acreage reflected a decrease. Sugar beet prices reflected an increase in value, as did market milk, and vegetable crops.

Livestock production in general, however, decreased during 1980.

It must be emphasized that these figures are gross returns and do not indicate net income, or profit.

A thanks is conveyed to the many individuals who provided information for this report and to my staff particularily Lewis H. Brautigam and Diane Reeves who compiled that information.
