COUNTY OF KINGS PUBLIC MEETING PROTOCOL IN RESPONSE TO CORONAVIRUS COVID-19

SUBJECT: FIFTH REDISTRICTING PUBLIC HEARING

SUMMARY:

Overview:

The County will hold as part of its 2021 redistricting process six (6) public hearings to engage the public. At its fifth public hearing on November 16, 2021, the County will continue discussions on the initial focus maps prepared by the public and by the County's consultant National Demographics Corporation: Public 101, NDC 201b, and NDC 201b. The County will also consider additional maps submitted after the October 20, 2021 that were not part of the fourth public hearing held on November 3, 2021. Such maps include Public 112, among potential others.

Recommendation:

Conduct the County's fifth redistricting public hearing to receive information from National Demographics Corporation about proposed supervisorial district maps and to receive public comment.

Fiscal Impact:

None.

BACKGROUND:

The County will hold six public hearings as part of its redistricting process. The County previously held four public hearings on July 20, 2021, July 27, 2021, August 31, 2021, and November 3, 2021. The County is scheduled to hold the two remaining public hearings on November 16, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. and December 7, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. At the November 16, 2021 hearing, the Board will continue to analyze the initial focus maps and additional draft maps submitted after October 20, 2021 to narrow and prioritize the map options for adoption at the December 7, 2021 public hearing. Maps that were submitted by November 8, 2021 will be part of the map

review process at the November 16, 2021 hearing. These maps may be reviewed prior to the hearing at <https://redistrictkings.com/draft-maps/>. The deadline to submit maps to be considered for adoption at the final public hearing, scheduled for December 7, 2021, is November 22, 2021 at 5 p.m.

Beyond ensuring that each district represents about the same number of constituents, redistricting determines how neighborhoods and communities are grouped together for the purposes of electing a Board member. The adopted redistricting map will be drawn in accordance with the Fair Maps Act and AB 1276, which states districts must be:

- Geographically contiguous (each supervisorial district should share a common border with the next),
- Respectful of the geographic integrity of local neighborhoods or communities in a manner that minimizes its division,
- Drawn with easily identifiable boundaries that follow natural or artificial barriers (rivers, streets, highways, rail lines, etc.), and,
- Drawn to encourage geographic compactness with boundaries not drawn for purposes of favoring or discriminating against a political party.

Members of the community are encouraged to participate. Notice of today's public hearing was published on the County's website www.RedistrictKings.com at least five (5) days in advance. Notice was also formally published in the Hanford Sentinel on November 6, 2021 and November 10, 2021. The public hearing has additionally been promoted through a November 10, 2021 press release and online through social media. Flyers announcing the hearing have been posted online and distributed via email to local community groups and all others that have requested notice. Local groups have additionally received telephone calls apprising them of the hearing. Upon conclusion of the hearing, the County will make available online recordings or written summaries of the public hearing.
