SUBJECT: FIFTH ORDER IN RESPONSE TO THE LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO

FLOODING

SUMMARY:

Overview:

On March 14, 2023, Proclamation 23-01 was ratified by the Board proclaiming a local emergency due to flooding conditions. As a result, on March 16, 2023, the Board issued the First Order regulating flood flows, and took action again on March 17, 2023 issuing the Secord Order regulating flood flows. On April 4, 2023, the Board issued the Third Order regulating public access in and around waterbodies and waterways in addition to concerns about the use of airspace for non-essential flight. On June 27, 2023, conditions in the rivers continued to evolve and a Fourth Order was brought forward for consideration to allow the public access to certain portions of the county. The water levels have returned to a reasonable level to allow additional recreational operation on the river.

Recommendation:

Issue the Fifth Order amending the Fourth Order of the Board of Supervisors in response to a local emergency due to flooding.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no fiscal impact with this recommended action.

BACKGROUND:

Conditions in the county rivers continue to evolve and flows in the rivers are reducing to levels consistent with allowing access to public access areas in Kings County in and on the river channels. Therefore, provisions in the Fourth Order, issued by the Board on June 27, 2023, are proposed to be amended to account for these changes in conditions. Provisions of the Fourth Order prohibited individuals from being in and on the waters of the Main

Kings River, Dutch John Cut, Cole Slough, and North Fork Channels as long as flow rates in the Kings River Below Peoples Weir are greater than 5,000 cubic feet per second (CFS). This prohibition included boating with motorized or non-motorized boats, use of personal watercraft, sailing, water-skiing, paddleboarding, canoeing, kayaking, rafting, floating, wading, and swimming. The Fifth Order desires to modify certain provisions to allow the public to be in and on the Kings River, Tule River, the Cross Creek Canal and any other waterway within the County of Kings jurisdiction and to allow public access to the levees and parks that abut the river for recreational purposes. Addition provisions of the Fifth Order delegate authority to the Director of Emergency Services to take further action as necessary to limit or allow public access in and around the county's waterbodies and waterways during the course of the emergency. Fresno and Tulare Counties are opening their portions of the river on August 1, 2023.

The Fifth Order has been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form.

FOURTH-FIFTH ORDER OF THE COUNTY OF KINGS BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN RESPONSE TO A LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO FLOODING AMENDING THE BOARD'S THIRD ORDER PROHIBITING ALLOWING RECREATIONAL ACTIVITY ON THE RIVER AND ON CLOSURE OF THE LEVEES AND PARKS THAT ABUT THE RIVER INRESPONSE TO A LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO FLOODING

DATE OF ORDER: JUNE 27 AUGUST 1, - 202023

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WHEREAS, on March 10, 2023, the Kings County Emergency Services Director issued Proclamation 23-01 pursuant to Government Code Section 8630 and Section 6-7 of the County of Kings Code of Ordinances proclaiming a local emergency in Kings County due to conditions of disaster and extreme peril to the safety of persons and property caused by the large amounts of snow accumulated in the Sierra Nevada Mountains, precipitation from atmospheric river storms and imminent flooding the County will experience as a result;

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2023, Proclamation 23-01 was ratified by the Kings County Board of Supervisors and remains in full force and effect;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 8634, the Board of Supervisors is empowered to make and issue orders and regulations during a local emergency on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property;

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2023, the Board of Supervisors issued a Third Order regulating public access in and around waterbodies and waterways, and urging all persons to avoid the airspace above and around waterbodies and waterways;

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2023, the Board of Supervisors issued a Fourth Order amending it's Third Order to allow for greater public access to the County's waterbodies and waterways due to decreases in the rates of water flow; and

WHEREAS, emergency conditions in and around the <u>County's</u> waterbodies and waterways within the <u>County</u>-have <u>continued to</u> evolve <u>and the rates of water flow therein have continued to decrease; d-making</u>

WHEREAS, in response to the changed conditions, the Board of Supervisors desires to it appropriate to modify certain provisions of the allow recreational activity on and in the Kings River, Tule River, the Cross Creek Canal and any other waterway excluding canals and ditches within the County of Kings Jurisdiction and to allow public access to the Levees and Parks that abut the River; and Board of Supervisors' Third Order to allow greater public access;

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors also desires to delegate authority to the Director of Emergency Services to take further action as necessary to limit or allow public access in and around the County's waterbodies and waterways during the course of this emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ordered as follows:

- 1. All prior emergency orders and regulations issued by the Board of Supervisors shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this order and the regulations contained herein.
- Notwithstanding any prior order issued pursuant to this emergency, the public shall be allowed on and in the Kings River, Tule River, the Cross Creek Canal and any other waterway within the County of Kings Jurisdiction and shall be allowed to access the County's levees and parks that abut the River for recreational purposes.
- 3. The area identified as the Tulare Lake shall remain closed to public access.

 Landowners are exempt for business related purposes to access the Lake at their own risk. Recreation is not allowed on the Tulare Lake for any persons.
- 4. The Director of Emergency Services is delegated the authority to take further action as necessary to limit or allow public access in and around the County's waterbodies, waterways, levies and parks excluding canals and ditches in response to this ongoing emergency.
- The orders and regulations issued on March 16, 2023, March 17, 2023, and April
 4, 2023, by the Board of Supervisors remain in full force and effect, except as
 modified by this order and the regulations contained herein.
- Section 2 of the Third Order of the County of Kings Board of Supervisors issued
 April 4, 2023 is amended as follows:

During the existence of the local emergency, all persons are prohibited from being in or on the waters above the Lemoore Weir of the Main Kings River, which includes, Dutch John Cut, Cole Slough, and in the South Fork Kings River below the Empire Weir #2. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, boating with motorized or non-motorized boats, use of personal watercraft, sailing, waterskiing, paddleboarding, canoeing, kayaking, rafting, floating, wading, and swimming. Excepting that private landowners in the referenced areas may access the Kings River from their private property and be in the waterway in and around their property for any and all uses except navigating downstream in any non-motorized capacity to include floating. The area identified as the Tulare Lake is closed to public access. Landowners are exempt for business related purposes to access the lake at their own risk. Recreation is not allowed on the Tulare Lake for any persons.

- 3. Section 3, Section 4, and Section 5 of the Third Order of the County of Kings Board of Supervisors issued on April 4, 2023, are hereby revoked.
- 4-5. A copy of this order shall be posted online on the Kings County Board of Supervisors web page. Copies shall additionally be posted outside at the Kings County Government Center and in one public place within any area of the County within which this order and regulation applies. Personnel of the County of Kings

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shall endeavor to make copies of this order and regulation available to the news media.
