Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors authorize the transfer of \$1,900,000 from the High-Speed Rail Mitigation fund which sits in an outside fund to be added to the Community Development Budget unit 270000 to pay for the associated costs of the Kings County General Plan and Development Code. The total cost of the General plan is estimated to be around \$1,900,000.

BACKGROUND:

The current Kings County General Plan was adopted by the Board of Supervisors on January 26, 2010. Following the approval of the General Plan, the High-Speed Rail Authority considered multiple routes for the High-Speed Rail system, of which two routes were contemplated running through Kings County. Kings County provided comments and feedback on the two possible routes during the High-Speed Rail Authorities processing of the

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) document, but those concerns were not addressed within the Final approved Environmental Document that the High-Speed Rail Authority adopted.

Therefore, in June of 2014, the County of Kings filed a CEQA lawsuit against the California High-Speed Rail Authority due to impacts that were not addressed within the adopted CEQA document. In August of 2019 the Kings County Board of Supervisors authorized the Chairman to execute a settlement agreement, cooperative agreement, and ownership and maintenance agreement with the High-Speed Rail Authority which included funding to be paid to the County of Kings to cover the costs associated with the relocation of Fire Station No. 4 and to update the General Plan due to impacts from the High-Speed Rail project. The High-Speed Rail project has progressed with development in Kings County, and it is now possible to review the true land use impacts of the project and update the Kings County General Plan and Development Code.

AUCTION

SUMMARY:

Overview:

In accordance with Chapter 7, Part 6, of Division 1 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, and with the approval of the Board of Supervisors, the Tax Collector has the authority to sell at public auction tax-defaulted property that is subject to the Tax Collector's power of sale. Properties become subject to the Tax Collector's power of sale if they have been declared tax defaulted for five years or longer. Tax-defaulted properties are subject to the power of sale by the Tax Collector in accordance with California Revenue and Taxation Code Section 3691 for nonpayment of delinquent taxes. In addition to mailing notices to each owner, Public Notices were published in June 2023.

Recommendation:

- a. Approve the "Request to Sell Tax-Defaulted Property Subject to the Power of Sale" at a public internet auction and the "Authorization and Report of Sales," which lists the properties;
- b. Authorize the Assistant Finance Director to reduce the minimum bid price if no bids are received during the initial auction:
- c. Approve the re-offer of unsold parcels at the same sale or next scheduled auction within 90 days with notification to parties of interest.

Fiscal Impact:

The minimum bid for auctioned properties is set so that the County recovers the cost of the sale, and can pay the outstanding delinquent taxes levied against the sold properties. The Tax Collector would recover an estimated \$286,600 in taxes, fees, penalties, and interest if all properties were sold at the tax sale for the minimum bids listed in the Authorization report attached.

BACKGROUND:

A "Notice of the Power to Sell Tax-Defaulted Property" (Notice) is recorded after a property has entered default for failure to pay property taxes that were initially assessed at least five or more years ago. Although installment payment plans exist to help property owners avoid a Notice, the property owner must request to enter a plan prior to the Notice being recorded. After the Notice is recorded, the property owner can only redeem the property by paying the delinquent taxes and any outstanding costs in full. This final payment can be made any time before the close of business on the last business day prior to the date the property is to be sold at auction. Properties subject to the Tax Collector's power of sale are listed on the "Authorization and Report of Sales" form, which is attached.

The Tax Collector intends to sell the properties at a public internet auction as allowed under Revenue and Taxation Code §3692.2 for at least the minimum bid price listed in the "Authorization and Report of Sales." The minimum bid prices are calculated pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code Section 3698.5 to recover the cost of the sale and delinquent taxes owed on each property. If the purchase price exceeds the redemption amount plus sale costs, the parties of interest are notified of their right to claim the excess proceeds. Parties of interest include the property owners and lienholders of record, which are determined by the County's contracted title search provider.

Where property has been offered for sale at least once, and no acceptable bids were received at the minimum bid price, Revenue and Taxation Code Section 3698.5(c) allows the Tax Collector, with Board's approval, to reoffer the property at the next scheduled sale for a new minimum price. The new minimum price will be one that the Tax Collector deems appropriate in light of the most current assessed valuation of that property or any unique circumstance with respect to the property. The upcoming public internet auction will include one (1) parcel re-offered at a reduced minimum bid. This parcel is notated as a "RE-OFFER" on the attached "Authorization and Report of Sales" form.

The Board has the authority to either approve or disapprove the proposed sale in its entirety or delete specific parcels and approve the sale of the remaining parcels. Following approval, however, the Board may not delete, withdraw, or withhold properties from the public auction, nor rescind its approval for sale. The next public internet auction via www.govease.com is tentatively scheduled to be held on March 7, 2024.

There is no financial impact to joining GSFA and GSCA, and there is no obligation for an individual member county to provide funds to GSFA and GSCA, absent a separate future agreement to participate in one (or more) of GSFA's or GSCA's specific programs.

BACKGROUND:

The Rural County Representatives of California (RCRC) is dedicated to representing the collective unique interests of its membership, providing legislative and regulatory representation at the State and Federal levels, and providing responsible services for its members to enhance and protect the quality of life in rural California counties. RCRC is a thirty-nine-member county strong service organization that champions policies on behalf of California's rural counties. On November 8 2022, Kings County adopted a resolution to support joining RCRC.

Within RCRC exist affiliate organizations such as GSFA, GSCA, and ESJPA. SUBJECT: CITY ANNEXATION OF COUNTY ISLANDS

SUMMARY:

Overview:

There are six county islands that are substantially surrounded within the city of Hanford that the County must maintain and serve. This creates operational inefficiencies and also confusion with residents as to whom they contact for certain issues and situations. The City of Hanford (City) is willing to annex the six islands. As such, this memorandum of understanding (MOU) will memorialize the City's initiation of proceeding to annex the six islands.

Recommendation:

Approve the memorandum of understanding with the City of Hanford to initiate the annexation of six county islands that are substantially surrounded within the city of Hanford.

Fiscal Impact:

The six county islands, comprised of about 309 parcels, have a combined property tax roll of about \$539,400 for 2023, which includes about \$4,037 in direct assessments. From the \$539,400 in billed property taxes, the County gets 1%, or \$5,394. This 1% is then divided between several agencies in the county who get a portion of the 1% (cities, cemeteries, water agencies, school districts, etc.). From this 1%, the County General Fund would get about 13.96% (\$753), the Fire Fund would get about 6.38% (\$344), and the Library Fund would get about 1.80% (\$98). If annexed, the City would receive about \$154 of General Fund's portion and about \$70 of Fire Fund's portion as per the Master Tax Sharing Agreement which outlines property tax transfers for annexations.

BACKGROUND:

Currently there six county islands that are substantially surrounded by the city of Hanford that are the County's

responsibility for service and maintenance. The services and the maintenance provided by the County to these islands are similar to the services and maintenance the City provides to the surrounding areas, creating operational inefficiencies in addition to confusion among residents as to whom they are served by. Confusion among residents also occurs for public safety matters such as law enforcement and fire, however this MOU and the annexation will not impact the Mutual Aid Agreement that the Kings County Fire Department has with the City.

In order to address these operational inefficiencies and confusion among residents, the City is willing to annex these six islands. Upon annexation, the County will allocate applicable property tax revenue to the City for the islands as per the Master Tax Sharing Agreement previously executed in the early 90s.

This MOU provides a path for the City to initiate annexation proceedings for five of the six county islands (labeled 9, 11, 12, 13, and 14 in the MOU) within 18 months of execution. The City will begin annexation proceedings for the sixth island (labeled 10 in the MOU) within 18 months when the land in this island is no longer considered Prime Agricultural Land pursuant to California Government Code 56064.

The Kings County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) approved these annexations at their August 23, 2023 meeting. On October 3, 2023, the City did the same.

This MOU has been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form.

Memorandum of Understanding

Annexation of Six Substantially Surrounded Islands within the City of Hanford

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") by and between the County of Kings, a pollical subdivision of the State of California (the "County), and the City of Hanford, a municipal corporation (the "City"), (collectively the "Parties"), provides as follows:

WHEREAS, there are six (6) unincorporated territories substantially surrounded by the City ("County Islands"), that are more particularly described in the attached **Exhibit A**, shown as Island 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14, which is incorporated herein by reference;

WHEREAS, the County must currently maintain and provide services to the County Islands;

WHEREAS, the County's provision of services to the County Islands creates operational inefficiencies, including, but not limited to, inefficiencies where the City and the County provide the same service to different portions of the same neighborhood within each jurisdiction and crisscrossing the other's territory as it provides said services;

WHEREAS, confusion is generated among some residents as to which jurisdiction is responsible for addressing problems and concerns, or who they should approach to obtain assistance;

WHEREAS, the City is willing to annex the County Islands to improve services and provide better responsiveness to residents about concerns within their affected neighborhoods;

WHERAS, upon annexation of the County Islands, the County will allocate revenues to the City according to the Master Tax Sharing Agreement, as previously negotiated between the Parties;

WHEREAS, the City and the County each have unique concerns about the financial implications of the City's annexation of the County Islands, including the transfer of tax revenues and the cost of new service to be provided by the City;

WHEREAS, the City and the County have agreed to certain terms that will provide a vehicle for addressing a portion of the new costs that will be incurred by the City as a result of the annexation of the County Islands;

WHEREAS, this MOU will provide a clear path for the City to initiate and complete annexation of the County Islands; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County desire to memorialize these terms by executing an MOU.

NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:


- 1. The recitals set forth above are hereby incorporated into this MOU by reference.
- 2. The City will initiate the process to annex the County Islands upon execution of this MOU.
- 3. The City will utilize a good faith effort to complete the annexation of the County Islands labeled as No.'s 9, 11, 12, 13, and 14 within 18 months of MOU execution.
- 4. The City will utilize a good faith effort to complete the annexation of the County Island labeled as No. 10 within 18 months of when all of the land located within that area is no longer considered Prime Agricultural Land pursuant to Government Code 56064.

- 5. This MOU does not amend the agreement for automatic mutual aid for fire services executed by the City and the County, which was effective on December 22, 2015 ("Auto Aid Agreement"). The terms of the Auto Aid Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, and it is the Parties' intent that the terms of that Auto Aid Agreement shall apply to the County Islands after their annexation by the City.
- 6. The County and the City are the only parties to this MOU and are the only parties entitled to enforce its terms. Nothing in this MOU bestows, is intended to bestow, or shall be construed to bestow any right or benefit, whether directly, indirectly, or otherwise, to any third persons.
- 7. If an action at law or in equity is necessary to enforce or interpret the terms of this MOU, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees, costs and necessary disbursements in addition to any other reasonable relief to which it may be entitled.
- 8. Amendments to this MOU shall be effective only if they are in writing and signed by both Parties.

SUBJECT:

Approval of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Hanford and Kings County, pertaining to the annexation of the remaining "substantially surrounded islands" within the City of Hanford.

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation: Authorize the City to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with Kings County for the annexation of the remaining substantially surrounded islands.

Recommended Motion: I move to execute the MOU, as presented.

As part of the Reorganization project, underway by QK, the City has prepared a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), agreeing that the City will annex the remaining substantially surrounded islands (Island 9-14) from the Kings County jurisdiction within an 18-month period.

The MOU agrees to a timeline and transition of services upon annexation. The substantially surrounded islands are subject to streamlined proceedings, in accordance with State Law.

On August 23, 2023, Kings County LAFCo voted to direct County staff to work with the City to move forward with the execution of the proposed MOU. Following direction from the Kings County Executive Officer, Chuck Kinney, Island 14 was also included in the annexation efforts, since the property is substantially surrounded on 75% by the City limits.

Background

In 2015, Kings LAFCO conducted an island study to determine where unincorporated islands and substantially surrounded areas existed within each of the four incorporated Cities within Kings County. Resulting from that Study your Commission directed staff to begin a dialogue with the Cities to encourage annexation of said islands and substantially surrounded areas to help promote a more efficient way of providing services to those areas. In 2022 the City of Hanford annexed all but one remaining unincorporated island and that last unincorporated island is up for consideration on the August 23, 2023 LAFCO meeting.

In an effort to continue the work to clean up the Cities boundaries the City of Hanford has drafted a Memorandum of Understanding in which they desire to enter into with the County of Kings, which would establish parameters for the annexation of the five remaining unincorporated substantially surrounded areas. With these areas annexed the City of Hanford's boundaries would no longer have any areas left which fall under the island and substantially surrounded lands as defined by the Cortese Knox Hertzberg Act.

The City of Hanford has requested that your Commission review the draft Memorandum of Understanding to provide any feedback concerning the terms listed within the MOU.

Recommend

The Executive Officer recommends that the LAFCO Commission review the draft Memorandum of Understanding and provide any feedback desired. Furthermore since the City is pursuing annexation of these last unincorporated areas which are surrounded by the City, in good faith of their efforts, direct staff to continue processing of all annexation applications submitted by the City in a timely manor provided that the conditions of the MOU are met.
