Argument IN FAVOR of Measure H

KINGS COUNTY ELECTIONS

Measure H is crucial for Hanford's future. It improves public safety, addresses homelessness, repairs our roads, and ensures a better tomorrow for our community. Here's how Measure H will improve Hanford:

- Recruit and retain top-tier police officers, reducing crime and keeping our neighborhoods secure.
- Ensure our Fire Department has the necessary staff and equipment to handle increasing emergency calls effectively.
- Repair and improve roadways, and maintain all streets in excellent condition, allowing for smooth and safe travel.
- Maintain and enhance parks, keeping them safe, clean, and up to the highest standards for our children and community.
- Address homelessness, providing enforcement and resources toward the city's comprehensive approach to the issue where they are needed most.

Currently, Hanford is one of only 32 cities out of California's 483 cities without a local sales tax. Because of this, 87% of revenue from local spending and the 1.1 million visitors who shop, dine, and stay in Hanford each year go to Kings County and Sacramento, with only 13% staying local. Measure H will change that, generating an estimated \$19 million annually, all of which will be used exclusively in Hanford. None of these funds can be taken by the state or go towards salaries or pensions for city administrators.

Measure H revenue will be distributed in accordance with a spending plan that was developed by a committee of Hanford residents, not politicians. It was placed on the ballot with the full support of our City Council to let voters decide what kind of future they want for our community. It includes strict accountability, spending overseen by a Citizens Oversight Committee, public disclosure of all spending, and annual independent financial audits, giving residents confidence that these funds are working for them.

Support a safer, better Hanford by voting YES on Measure H.
